Student Services - Ms. LeSann

If you are interested in a program at Saskatchewan Polytechnic (formerly SIAST) the deadline to apply for Competitive entry programs like the Saskatchewan Combined Bachelor of Science in Nursing (SCBScN) is February 15th, 2023. For High Demand programs (Dental Hygiene, Nursing, Medical Laboratory Assistant/Technology, among other programs) the deadline to apply is also February 15th, 2023. For all first qualified first admitted programs the sooner you apply the better, so get that application in.

Grade 12 Students – Reminder – Please continue to check your application status and university portals for communication with your institution. Your program may require additional documentation or might want you to confirm your acceptance. Please check these portals at least once a week for important information.

You may now apply directly into the College of Education at the University of Regina. The deadline for the Teacher Education Application & Profile available at Student Services is March 1st, 2023 and it is now available online at http://www.uregina.ca/education/future-students/how-to-apply.html. Check the University of Regina webpage to ensure you meet the requirements for grade 12 courses at http://www.uregina.ca/futurestudents/admissions/hsstudents/saskatchewan/index.html. You may consult this webpage at any time to see if you meet the grade twelve requirements for admission to a variety of programs at the University of Regina.

You may also apply directly into the College of Education at the University of Saskatchewan. The deadline for applications is February 15th, 2023. Students can apply for direct entry into the Elementary/Middle Years, Secondary, Music, or the combined Kinesiology/Education program. Check the University of Saskatchewan webpage to ensure you meet the requirements for grade 12 courses at http://explore.usask.ca/programs/colleges/education/index.php You may consult the University of Saskatchewan Admissions page at any time to see if you meet the requirements for admission to a variety of other programs at the University of Saskatchewan http://explore.usask.ca/programs/.

Final marks must be ordered from the Ministry of Education at https://www.k12.gov.sk.ca/etranscript/. Students and guardians must complete a request for High School Transcripts form and pay for the transcripts to be mailed or digitally sent to post-secondary institutions. Please make your selections carefully and ensure that you are ordering all of the transcripts that your particular institution requires. The Ministry of Education will then forward the final transcript of marks directly in February and July but you need to select that option when you order. Entrance scholarship applications are generally earlier than application deadlines, for example, the U of S scholarship application and supporting documents deadline is March 1st, and the U of R deadline varies depending upon the scholarships that are being applied for. Look at the website for the post secondary school of your choice; the websites are most up to date and accurate. I highly recommend that you apply for these scholarships which could help with the financial burden of attending university.

Non-Academic Scholarships: Many grade 12 students don't apply for scholarships because they don't think their marks are high enough. www.studentawards.com is an awards database that can help! It lists plenty of awards that are not based on grades or academic achievement. There are even contests that all students can enter.

Local Scholarships: Grade 12 students will soon be receiving a list of local scholarships that they may be interested in applying for. This list will be distributed before finals to all grade 12 students. Students will read over the list of potential local scholarships and indicate on the form the scholarships (based on the criteria presented) that they are eligible to apply. The deadline to return this checklist will be February 3rd. Before February Break each student will receive a package from Ms. LeSann to complete and hand in at the end of March.

GRADE 11 STUDENTS AND PARENTS: Your grade 11 marks are very important if you are planning on applying to university next year. Please make sure you are prepared for final exams in January. Remember to take sufficient amount of time off work to accommodate your study schedule during exam week. Now is the time to be booking off days for work.

Grade 11 students will begin making appointments with Ms. LeSann in the next month to continue their post-secondary planning.
